Option 1: Technical Core (Block) Credit

Option 2: Advisor-approved elective hours as needed to total 60 semester hours of upper level credit and 124 total semester hours.	

Other Requirements

1. Students who do not complete MG 320 at Athens State University are required to take GBA 300 Business Research Skills, a 1 semester hour course dealing with library research skills and business information sources.
2. Earning an acceptable score on an assessment exam containing questions dealing with the competency and skill areas around which the curriculum is based (exam given in MG 420).
3. Completion of the Capstone course, MG 420 Business Policy, with a final average of at least 70%.
4. Minimum hours for graduation are 124 semester hours. Must include a minimum of 60 semester hours of upper level college/university credit (300/400 Level Credit). Lower level 100/200) courses which are accepted to meet a particular upper level course requirement DO NOT count toward the required 60 semester hours of upper level credit. A minimum of 33 of the last 39 semester hours must be completed with Athens State University.
