## **Transfer of Credit/Degree Requirements**

- Students may transfer a maximum of 72 lower division or 90 total semester credit hours
- \*Lower division courses (100-200 level) that are similar in content to Argosy required courses as determined by the appropriate Argosy office do not need to be retaken; however, the upper division (300-400 level) credit must be replaced with another upper division elective.
- The following are requirements for the BSCJ degree:
