Emergency Medical Technician Program and degree information

Upon successful completion, the candidate is eligible to receive a Technical Certificate and challenge the National Registry exam to obtain National Certification as an Emergency Medical Technician and apply for a Tennessee State license as an EMT. Information is available from the Tennessee Department of Health, Emergency Medical Services Board. Initial EMT License Requirements in TN are available online.

The National Registry certification is used by 46 states as a basis for licensure. Students pursing this program who live outside of Tennessee or plan to move to another state are warned there may be additional requirements needed to obtain licensure or certification in another state. Consult the appropriate state licensing/certification board to determine if the chosen program of study will meet the requirements in the state(s) where you intend to seek employment. Columbia State has not determined if requirements are met for licensure in all states or territories of the United States. These states are identified as "Does Not Meet." Even if identified in the table below as Meets, it is possible requirements have changed since last reviewed. Please contact the appropriate licensing board in the state where you intend to seek licensure regarding the requirements in that state.
